I KEPT WATERING, HUGGING, AND SPEAKING TO IT — LETTING IT KNOW IT WASN'T ALONE ON ITS JOURNEY BACK TO HEALTH. KELLY MCCUE







THE NEW LONDON FIRE
DEPARTMENT PRESENTED THE
ANNUAL FIRE SAFETY
DEMONSTRATION ON JULY 16TH
AT THE HILLTOP BARN. THEY
BROUGHT DEMONSTRATION
EQUIPMENT AS WELL AS THEIR
2023 ENGINE 2 WHICH
CONTAINS EXTRICATION TOOLS
TO REMOVE TRAPPED VICTIMS
IN VEHICLE ACCIDENTS.



THERE WERE 42 ATTENDEES IN THE AUDIENCE, 10 ATTENDEES ON ZOOM AND ADDITIONAL INQUIRIES FROM OWNERS WISHING TO WATCH THE VIDEO OF THE DEMONSTRATION (VIDEO1591227115.MP4). TWO ITEMS WERE SHOWN AT THE DEMONSTRATION. FIRST, THERE WAS A THERMAL IMAGING DRONE THAT CAN PERFORM A 360-DEGREE EVALUATION OF A BURNING BUILDING TO ASSIST FIRE FIGHTERS WITH QUICK DECISION MAKING. IT CAN ALSO HELP IN LOCATING LOST HIKERS, MISSING SWIMMERS, AND FOREST FIRES. THE SECOND PIECE OF EQUIPMENT, A LASER TECHNOLOGY SIMULATOR, WAS PURCHASED FOR PUBLIC TRAINING PURPOSES. THE SIMULATOR IS USED TO TEACH HOW TO USE A FIRE EXTINGUISHER PROPERLY IN OUR HOMES AND WAS DEMONSTRATED BY THE NEW LONDON FIRE DEPARTMENT OFFICERS AS WELL AS ONE HILLTOP OWNER! WE LEARNED THAT TO EFFECTIVELY USE AN EXTINGUISHER, IT SHOULD BE AIMED AT ABOUT 8 FT FROM A SOURCE OF FIRE. MIKE MATTHY, FIRE SAFETY OFFICER, THANKED THE HILLTOP COMMUNITY FOR THEIR GENEROUS DONATIONS TOWARDS PURCHASE OF NEW EQUIPMENT. TWO ADDITIONAL TAKE AWAY TIPS THAT WERE SHARED WERE TO WRITE THE DATE OF EXPIRATION OF YOUR SMOKE/CO DETECTOR ON THE SIDE OF THE UNIT WITH A BLACK SHARPY SO THAT YOU DO NOT HAVE TO TAKE THE UNIT DOWN TO CHECK FOR THE EXPIRATION DATE. MANY HAVE A LIFE EXPECTANCY OF 10 YEARS. ALSO, YOUR ELECTRICAL OUTLETS CAN BE TESTED FOR INCORRECT WIRING CONDITIONS WITH AN OUTLET RECEPTACLE TESTER THAT CAN BE PURCHASED INEXPENSIVELY AT A LOCAL HARDWARE STORE. A SIGN-UP SHEET WAS AVAILABLE FOR OWNERS WHO WANTED TO PURCHASE A FIRE BLANKET. IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO PURCHASE A FIRE BLANKET, PLEASE CONTACT A MEMBER OF THE FIRE SAFETY AND PREVENTION COMMITTEE. IT WAS IMPRESSIVE TO NOTE THAT APPROXIMATELY 90% OF THOSE IN ATTENDANCE CURRENTLY OWN A FIRE BLANKET. OCTOBER IS THE NATIONAL FIRE SAFETY/PREVENTION MONTH. LOOK FOR OUR EDUCATIONAL DISPLAY AT THE HILLTOP COMMUNITY HOUSE DURING THAT MONTH. ONE YEAR AGO, WHO KNEW. CLEARLY THE EDUCATIONAL EFFORTS OF THE FIRE SAFETY AND PREVENTION COMMITTEE ARE BEING WELCOMED BY OUR NEIGHBORS.
