APPLE CRISP

PREP TIME - 25 MINUTES
COOKING TIME - 30 MINUTES

5-6 PEELED, SLICED APPLES SUGAR 1/4 CUP WATER 1 TEASPOON CINNAMON EASE OF PREPARATION - EASY
YIELD - 6 SERVINGS

1 CUP FIRMLY PACKED BROWN

1/2 CUP SOFTENED MARGARINE 3/4 CUP ALL-PURPOSE FLOUR

ARRANGE APPLES IN A DEEP, BUTTERED, 2-QUART BAKING DISH. ADD WATER AND SET ASIDE. BLEND CINNAMON, FLOUR, BROWN SUGAR AND MARGARINE WITH A FORK UNTIL CRUMBLY. PAT OVER THE APPLES. BAKE AT 350 DEGREES FOR ABOUT 30 MINUTES OR UNTIL APPLES ARE TENDER AND CRUST IS BROWN. SERVE WARM. PAIRS ESPECIALLY WITH MAPLE WHISKEY ICE CREAM FROM SANCTURY FARM.



CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

THIS SUMMER HAS BEEN BOTH PRODUCTIVE AND EVENTFUL AT HILLTOP PLACE. AFTER A SLOWER START, WE ARE NOW OPERATING AT FULL CAPACITY. I WOULD LIKE TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO THANK ALL OWNERS FOR THEIR PATIENCE AS WE COMPLETED THE DRAINAGE WORK IN CLUSTER FOUR. I'M PLEASED TO ANNOUNCE THAT THIS PROJECT IS ALMOST FINISHED, WITH ONLY MINOR PAVING WORK REMAINING. AS WE CONTINUE TO ASSESS OUR BUDGET, WE WILL SHIFT FOCUS TO THE DRAINAGE SYSTEM IN CLUSTER TWO.

COBB HILL IS WORKING HARD TO REMAIN ON SCHEDULE. WITH THE SLAB SUCCESSFULLY POURED, WE ARE NOW MOVING INTO THE FRAMING PHASE, AND TRUSS PACKAGES ARE EXPECTED TO ARRIVE SHORTLY. THERE IS STILL SIGNIFICANT WORK AHEAD, BUT WE ARE PLEASED TO SEE THIS DEVELOPMENT MOVING FORWARD AS PLANNED.

OUR MAINTENANCE TEAM HAS BEEN DILIGENT IN ADDRESSING VARIOUS TASKS THROUGHOUT THE COMMUNITY, INCLUDING MANY WORK ORDERS, WINDOW AND BUILDING REPAIRS, SHRUB AND TREE REMOVAL, AND REGULAR MOWING. THEY HAVE ALSO BEEN INSTRUMENTAL IN RESOLVING ISSUES RELATED TO OUR ONGOING PROJECTS. IN THE COMING WEEKS, THE TEAM WILL TRANSITION TO FALL CLEANUP, AIR CONDITIONER REMOVAL, AND PREPARING FOR THE UPCOMING SNOW SEASON.

WE LOOK FORWARD TO A PRODUCTIVE FALL SEASON AND APPRECIATE YOUR CONTINUED SUPPORT AS WE WORK TO MAINTAIN AND IMPROVE HILLTOP PLACE.



PHASE I

- DEAD LILAC TREE WAS REMOVED—THE REMAINING STUMP WILL BE FLATTENED AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE
- •TOPSOIL AND SEED WILL BE ADDED WHEREVER NEEDED

PHASE II (SPRING 2025)

- NO IN GROUND PLANTINGS WILL BE ADDED ALONG THE STONEWALL FOR EASE OF MAINTENANCE & ATTRACTIVENESS
- •THREE LARGE FLOWER POTS ARE PLANNED TO BE PLACED UNDER THE SIGN FOR SEASONAL COLOR
- •ALSO CONSIDERING THE ADDITION OF A SHRUB TO BE PLANTED AT THE FAR END OF THE STONEWALL
